



ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

A. SENDING AND RECEIVING INSTITUTIONS

Sending College: Kingsborough Community College (KCC)
Department: Behavioral Sciences
Program: Education Studies – 1st-6th Grade concentration
Degree: A.S.

Receiving College: Brooklyn College (BC)
Department: Childhood Bilingual and Special Education, hereafter, CBSE
Program: Childhood Education Teacher (Grades 1-6)

B. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

Completion of the A.S. degree. Pursuant to University policy, students who have earned a City University Associate of Science (A.S.) degree will be deemed to have automatically fulfilled the lower division liberal arts and science distribution requirements for a baccalaureate degree. However, students may be asked to complete courses required by Brooklyn College's requirements that was not part of the student's associate degree program. In such cases, any coursework required will be applied towards the total number of credits normally required for the baccalaureate degree. Applicants will follow the standard admissions process, which includes completing a transfer application.

Students must meet the following requirements to be accepted into the Childhood Education program at Brooklyn College. Students eligible for transfer to Brooklyn College under this agreement must have met at least the minimum requirements for admission to Brooklyn College which are:

Admissions Requirements for Senior College Program

- A.S. degree and a minimum GPA of 2.0 (C);
 - Passing grade in a credit-bearing mathematics course worth three or more credits;
 - Grade of C or better in freshman composition, its equivalency, or a higher-level English course;
 - A cumulative GPA of 2.70 or higher in liberal arts and science courses;
 - Except for students entering with an Associate Degree, each required education course must be completed with a grade of C or higher to be accepted as transfer. All education classes require a grade of C or higher.
 - DOE finger printing must be completed and cleared.
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Also, graduates of the A.S. degree program who have not completed at least one year of foreign language study (or established an equivalent proficiency) may be asked to complete six (6) to eight (8) credits of foreign language coursework (or establish an equivalent proficiency) in addition to their normal degree requirements. Proficiency may be established based upon high school coursework, native language abilities, or examination.

Total transfer credits granted toward the baccalaureate degree: 60

- A maximum of 6 credits towards College Option (Note: College Option requirement will be clarified once student transfers).

***Total additional credits required at the senior college to complete baccalaureate degree: 60**

***Total credits required for the B.A. in CBSE: 120**

C. Course Equivalences and / Transfer Credit Awarded

KCC graduates who complete the A.S. in Education Studies – 1st-6th Grade concentration will receive 60 credits toward the B.A. in Childhood Education Teacher (1st-6th Grade) in the CBSE Department at Brooklyn College.

Transferred credits will be applied to the Baccalaureate degree as course specific transfer credits and electives. Students should meet with a transfer advisor who will review their transcripts to ensure appropriate placement within the program.

D. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES

1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying, or terminating the agreement:

The sending and receiving departments at each college commit to meeting regularly to review and revise this articulation agreement in response to programmatic, curricular, and disciplinary changes. Receiving department agrees to update the course equivalencies once Kingsborough Community College and Brooklyn College have their new courses in CUNYfirst.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

We will use the CUNY Institutional Research Database to track our transferring students (i.e., progress, GPA, retention, and graduation).

3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:

This articulation agreement will be publicized on the KCC and BC websites. Transfer advisors at KCC will promote this agreement with eligible students, as will KCC's recruiters who work with potential students both in the high schools and in the wider community. When possible both programs will coordinate to provide information sessions to students on the subject of transferring either virtually or in person. Each fall and spring graduating majors in KCC-Education Studies will be provided with early enrollment forms to facilitate their transition into BC-CBSE.

E. Additional Information (e.g., financial aid, transfer scholarships)

Childhood (1st-6th Grade) majors at Brooklyn College have grade minimums for courses before they can proceed to the next "tier" of courses. Student must complete each tier of classes with an average grade of B and no grade below a C before they can register for the next tier of classes (see tiers listed below). KCC students must maintain a "B" average in major courses, with no grade lower than a C. Students who fail to maintain the grade minimum at KCC will be required to re-take the course(s) at BC in order to achieve a satisfactory grade. No course may be repeated more than once at BC.
